




Making a “Weavie” on the Quilt Weaver 7” square loom.




Start with a slip knot around the first two nails, top & bottom, on the left side of the loom.



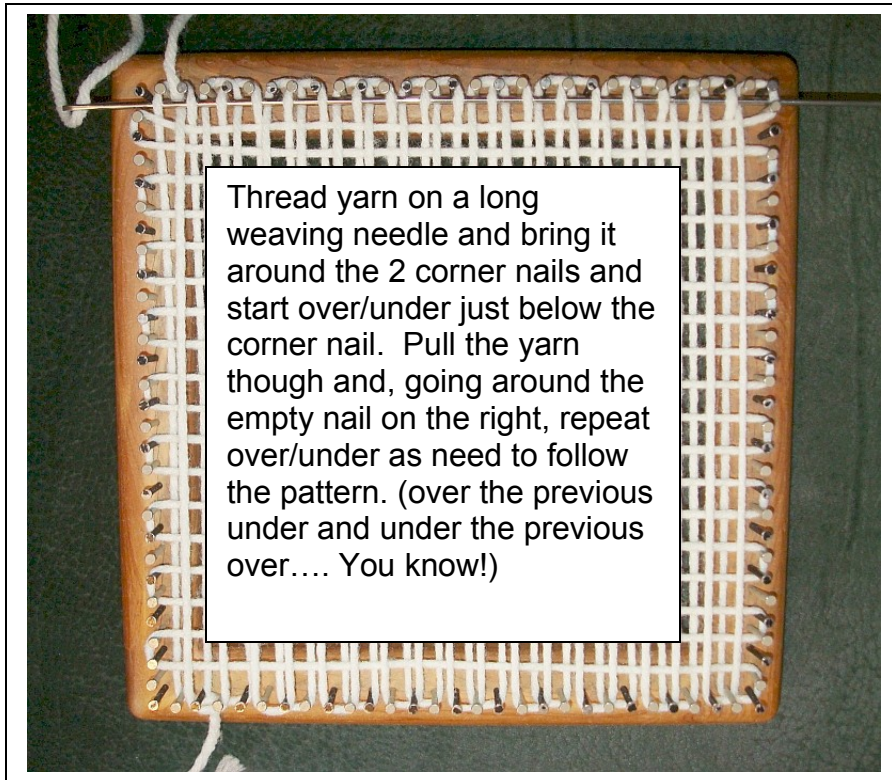
Bring the yarn around the 2nd nail to the right at the bottom and up to the top, skipping one nail and bring it back down, skipping one nail at the bottom. Repeat across. End bottom right. Go around the 3 corner nails and back across as in the photo.



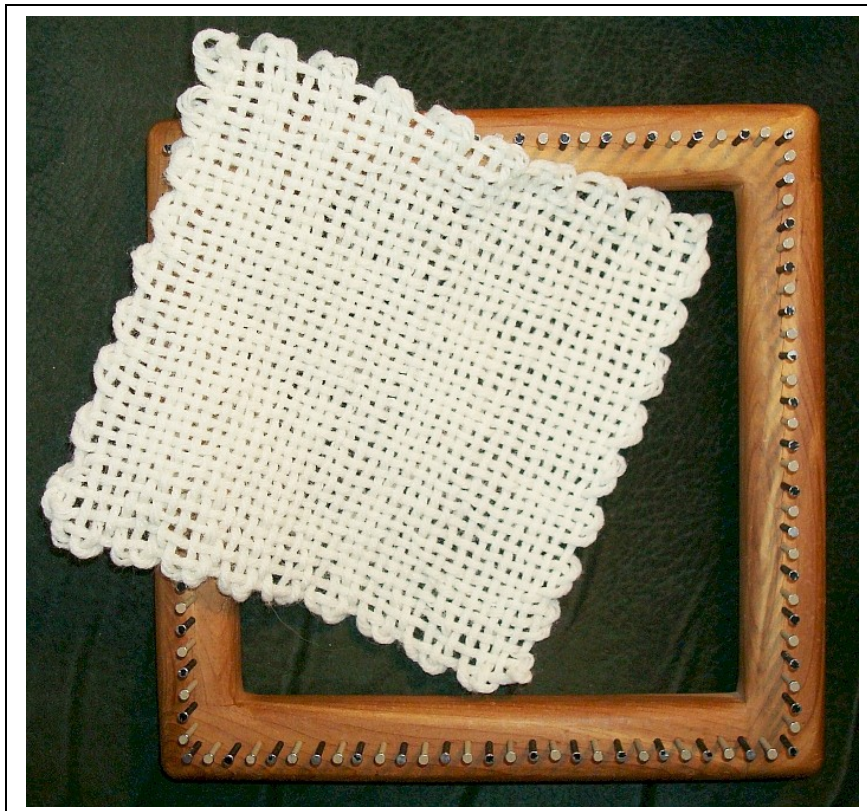
Continue in the pattern, going across the loom, this time until you reach the top right. Go around the 3 corner nails and down, as in the photo, coming out between the last 2, at bottom right..



Bring the yarn to the left around the 1st empty nail and up. You will go around a filled nail and an empty one and down again. Repeat across, ending at top left. Hold yarn in place and wrap it around the perimeter of the nails 5 ¼ times to measure the length needed to do the needle weaving.



Thread yarn on a long weaving needle and bring it around the 2 corner nails and start over/under just below the corner nail. Pull the yarn through and, going around the empty nail on the right, repeat over/under as need to follow the pattern. (over the previous under and under the previous over.... You know!)



Weave in the ends and carefully remove your block from the loom. If you are using cotton or any yarn with little elasticity, you will want to weave a little loosely. You'll need to measure your first block in order to get a gauge for your project, as some yarns will draw up more than others.
